Oberon Pi Quick Reference

Basic mouse commands

Left Click Set cursor

Middle Click Execute command

Right Click Select item

Scroll bar commands

Left Click Scroll document down Right Click Scroll document up

Shift Left Click Jump to end of document

To scroll the document by fewer lines of text, click near the *top* in the scroll bar. To scroll by more lines at once, click near the *bottom* in the scroll bar.

Text edit commands

Left Click Set text cursor Right Click Select character

Right Click Twice Select word/command name/file name

Left Drag Move text cursor one character left or right

Right Drag Extend text selection Shift Right Click Change text selection

The standard keyboard shortcuts are defined for the following editing commands:

Ctrl-X Edit.Cut
Ctrl-C Edit.Copy
Ctrl-V Edit.Paste
Ctrl-Z Edit.Undo

Before using these commands, you must first set the *text cursor* in the window you are editing. Doing this lets the system know which window is being edited.

Window selection

Left Click Select window for text editing

Ctrl-A Select window for window operation

All text-editing commands require a window to be selected for editing. This is done by setting the *text cursor* in the window (with Left Click).

Certain system commands require a window to be selected for window operations. This is done by setting the *marker symbol* in the window (with Ctrl-A).

Escape key

Esc Erase text cursor, marker symbol, and all text selections

Change marker

The *change marker* is a small hollow square in the upper-right corner of a text window. It appears if you make any editing changes in the window.

Directory command

System.Directory *.Mod System.Directory Hello*!

Use the wildcard character * to list multiple files, and the exclamation point! to list the file date and size.
